The Supreme Court legalized marriage equality, the Pentagon added "sexual orientation" as a protected class under its Military Equal Opportunity Policy, in Florida, then Gov. Rick Scott signed a bill allowing same-sex couples to adopt children, following a 2010 court ruling that overturned the law preventing couples from this right, in New Jersey, a jury ruled that "gay conversion therapy," designed to turn LGBT people straight violates the state's consumer fraud act, and on and on.

Unfortunately, we CANNOT be complacent. We CANNOT sit back on our laurels. We CANNOT take these victories for granted any more. We MUST fight with all of our might to protect these victories because there is a very real possibility that many of these amazing victories could be reversed. The annual 2019 Rainbows Festival and Street Fair is a celebration of the diversity of the LGBTQ community. Each year, the Rainbows Festival draws a crowd of over 25,000. Rainbows Festival is the 2nd largest LGBTQ event in the state of Arizona, only 2nd to the Phoenix Pride Festival.

DUET: A worthy non-profit we should all know about



Duet was started in 1981 by The Reverend Dr. Dosia Carlson and Church of theBeatitudes in Phoenix. Duet is a non-profit, interfaith organization that promotes health and well-being through its vitally needed, free-ofcharge services to homebound adults, family caregivers, faith communities, and grandfamilies.

From an article in the May 29th issue of the AZ

Republic: "Many LGBTQ+ family caregivers may have issues separately from those discussed in a regular support group, and they may feel more confident speaking openly in an environment of fellow LGBTQ+ community members", said George Burson, caregiver services coordinator for Duet and facilitator for the new support "Community Church of Hope is a space created specifically with the LGBTQ+ community in mind, so support group attendees may feel more at home there."

The LGBTQ+ community is growing and aging, Community Church of Hope is committed to partnering with Duet in their work to support those who care for our aging population," said Patrick Stout, pastor at CCoH. "Our location and facility will provide an open, safe environment for the facilitators and caregivers to share and learn how to assist our loved ones."

According to the Family Caregiver Alliance, some issues that specifically impact older LGBTQ+ family caregivers are: how "chosen family" (versus your family of origin) responsibilities may impact caregiving, employer issues, finding supportive health-care and service providers, experiencing mistreatment or discrimination, maintaining a sense of community and maintaining their own well-being.

Many of these same issues are faced among all family caregivers, but may prove particularly challenging for LGBTQ+ caregivers.
